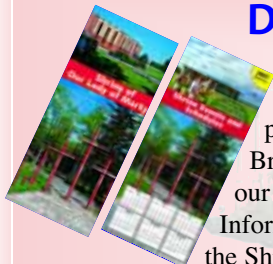

Find it at the Shrine: Part 4

Many times over the course of the Shrine season, we are asked about certain statues, altars, historical buildings and structures that are dotted throughout the sacred grounds of the Shrine. Continuing this week's Pilgrim, we are introducing you to various parts of the Shrine with pictures and information that might help you find and learn about many areas of the Shrine and where they are located on the vast grounds here at Auriesville.

The series is titled "Find it at the Shrine" and we hope it will give you a better understanding of what is here and what its significance is, if you don't already know. It is being prepared by Dorothy Domkowski, a loyal supporter of the Shrine and a member of the Shrine Council.

We hope you will enjoy the series and find it beneficial on your visits to the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs.



Find it at the Shrine

The Crucifix on the Shrine grounds commemorates the platform of torture. Here Jogues and Goupil suffered intensely for several days. They endured similar torments at other villages farther up the river. Then they began their slavery, working with the women in the fields and flats, near the Mohawk River.

Find it at the Shrine

The rugged simplicity and warmth of the St. Rene Goupil Chapel is a realistic memorial to the Jesuit martyrs buried here. Fourteen beautiful stained glass windows identify the Stations of the Cross. Sixteen additional stained glass windows pay homage to the eight North American Martyrs, Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, and the persons for whom the Buffalo Province houses are named. Visitors are welcome to visit the Chapel.



Day of Christian Movies:

Christ in Films

On Saturday, August 4th, 10:30am – 3:15pm, the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, Auriesville, NY will present a day of immersion into films on Christ. Fr. George Restrepo, S.J., who has his Master's degree from NYU in cinema, will host this event. There will be discussions and viewing of two main films: "The Life and Passion of Jesus Christ" (1905) and "From the Manger to the Cross" (1912). There will be an hour lunch break and food is available for purchase at the Visitor's Center. Following the final discussion, closing comments and prayer, the group will be invited to tour the grounds and attend the 4pm Mass in the Coliseum.

Mini-Retreat

On Thursday, July 26, Father McGuire will be holding another Mini-Retreat in the Kateri Chapel at 10 am to 2:30 pm. "World Mission of the Holy Spirit for Our Times" is the topic of this retreat.

Special Healing Services

On Saturday, July 28th, 12:30pm in the Coliseum of the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, Auriesville, NY, there will be a talk and special healing service provided by Fr. Machado, SOLT who makes his annual pilgrimage from Rome, Italy. This service generally runs until 4 pm.

On Sunday, July 29th, at 1:30pm in the Coliseum of the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, Auriesville, NY, there will be a talk given by Father LaFache, followed by benediction. Fr. LaFache will celebrate Mass at 4pm with special blessings given afterwards. Emma DeGouzman, mystic and visionary, will also be present at this service.

On Saturday, August 4th, at 9 am in the Coliseum of the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, Auriesville, NY, one of the Shrine Jesuits will celebrate a special healing Mass. There will be a blessing with relics offered at the end of the service. *Originally, this was scheduled to be done by Fr. Severson, but his failing health has prevented his appearance. Fortunately, the instruments of God's grace are not limited.*

Mission of Mercy

On the weekend of August 18th & 19th 2007, Al Barbarino will be a guest singer and speaker at the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs, in Auriesville, NY. Al is a Lay Franciscan of the St. Padre Pio Shelter in NYC, operating under the direction of Fr. Benedict Groeschel, cfr (Franciscan Friar of the Renewal). Over the past 16 years, Al has recorded CDs and Videos of spiritual and inspirational music which helps support the St. Padre Pio Shelter, war orphans of Croatia and Bosnia, as well as for the needy families of the parish/area wherever he sings. He has traveled throughout the world.

Al works in the NYC Prisons for youth (9-17) as a counselor. He has many stories to share. At the Shrine, he will offer a concert on Saturday at 7pm in the Coliseum, and will also sing and speak at each of the weekend liturgies. At the end of the concert and Masses, his CDs/Videos will be available. As a Franciscan, his goal is to EVANGELIZE and HELP THE POOR!

Catechesis Should Address Whole Person Says the Pope

VATICAN CITY, (Zenit.org).- Benedict XVI offered the example of one of the first Christian catechists as a role model for the Church of today.

The Pope dedicated his address at today's general audience in Paul VI Hall to the figure of St. Cyril of Jerusalem, a fourth-century bishop.

"Cyril's homilies make up a systematic catechesis on the rebirth of the Christian through baptism," the Holy Father explained.

He added: "To the catechumen, Cyril says: 'You have fallen into the nets of the Church. Let yourself be taken alive: Do not run away, because it is Jesus who takes you to his love, not to give you death but the resurrection after death. You must die and rise again. ... Die to sin, and live for justice, starting today.'"

The Pontiff highlighted three elements of Cyril's catechesis: doctrinal, moral and, as a synthesis of the first two, mystagogical.

Benedict XVI explained that Cyril's doctrinal teaching is based on Scripture, showing the "relationship between the two Testaments, pointing to Christ, the center of the universe."

His "morality is anchored in profound unity to the doctrinal one," the Pope explained. "Dogma slowly descends into souls, which are asked to change their pagan ways to adopt new life in Christ, the gift of baptism."

The Holy Father continued: "The 'mystagogical' catechesis, was the height of instruction that Cyril imparted, no longer to catechumens, but to the newly baptized and neophytes during Easter week. He led them to discover the mysteries still hidden in the baptismal rites of the Easter vigil.

"Enlightened by the light of a faith, deepened in the strength of baptism, the neophytes were finally able to better understand the mysteries, having just celebrated the rites."

Thus, the Pope affirmed, Cyril's catechesis is "integral ... involving the body, soul and spirit," which "remains emblematic of the catechetical formation of today's Christians."

Pope Offers Tool to Prepare for Youth Day

Invites Young People to Meditate on Holy Spirit

LORENZAGO DI CADORE, Italy, (Zenit.org).- Benedict XVI offered youth a spiritual roadmap to prepare themselves for World Youth Day, encouraging them to meditate on the love awakened by the Holy Spirit.

The Pope told young people this today before praying the midday Angelus from Mirabello Castle, a spot close to where he is vacationing till July 27.

Love "is the 'heart' of Christian life; in fact, only the love awakened in us by the Holy Spirit renders us witnesses to Christ," the Holy Father said. "I wanted to re-propose this important spiritual truth in the message for the 23rd World Youth Day, which will be made known next Friday, July 20: 'You will receive power from the Holy Spirit, who will descend upon you.'"

World Youth Day is exactly one year away. It will be held July 15-20, 2008, in Sydney, Australia.

"This is what I invite you to reflect on in the next months, dear young people, to prepare for our big meeting in Sydney, Australia, that, precisely in these days of July, will take place one year from now," the Pontiff told the youth gathered for the Angelus. Daily Prayer This Week

Sixteenth Week in Ordinary Time: July 22-28

These weekly guides offer us an opportunity to practice being "contemplatives in action." For us busy people, it is possible to pray - "to lift our minds and hearts to God" - in the midst of our everyday, active lives. Prayer is really about our relationship with the Lord, a relationship that is always a gift of the Holy Spirit. That relationship can stay alive, and grow in its intimacy, to the degree we can let the daily events, responsibilities and relationships of our lives become a part of our relationship with our Lord. All it takes is a little focus and some practice.

Every morning this week, we can begin our day with a brief conversation with our Lord that expresses a desire that comes from within us and is shaped by the scriptures this week. We might say, "O Lord, help me trust your presence in what you call me to do today, letting me remember how tiny seeds grow." I may pray: "Dear Lord, thank you for this day. Let me trust your care for me. Let me not be afraid or grumble, but fill me with the nourishment of your presence today." Or we might ask, "Lord, let me do your will today, and experience the closeness you offer me as I do so." Perhaps, we can pray, "Thank you, Lord, for the gift of my children. Help me to trust that not everything I say or do will seem to work, but that you will take care of them and allow my efforts to be fruitful." And, on the weekend, we might be praying, "Dear Lord, the relationship you are offering me is like a treasure that makes me want to sell what has seemed to be so important to me so that I might buy that field - investing more deeply in my relationship with you."

Throughout each day, we can repeat and refine these desires and prayers in our hearts. Each thing we do, each person we relate to, each request that is made of us will help us say this or that expression of gratitude or request for grace.

The practice comes in doing this ongoing conversation and connections with our Lord "in the background" of our day - in the brief in between times: in the shower, while getting dressed, on the way to work, while walking to a meeting, during a meeting, while shopping, as we transition from any part of our day to the next. It all comes together as we take a brief bit of time at night, before we go to bed, to say thanks for the graces we have received, for the opportunity to feel connected and know that we are not alone throughout the day. Sometimes, we'll ask the same thing for several days. At times, we'll notice a "pattern" in what we are asking for and what we experience ourselves as receiving. In this very simple way, with just a little focus and practice, we will find ourselves doing just what Jesus taught us - asking persistently, knocking on the door of a growing relationship with our Lord that transforms our spirits in the midst of our busy lives.
