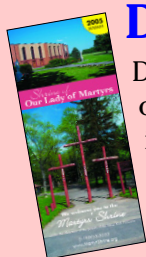

During Lent, she appeared very often on EWTN performing, "I Thirst", the crucifixion story, with her sister Tatiana. She is joined for this concert by her husband, Tiho Borosak, on guitar.
